Aberglaslyn Hall

At Aberglaslyn Hall there are many opportunities for Leicestershire & Rutland DofE Centres to access both the facilities on offer and qualified staff in order to deliver safe and effective DofE Expeditions.

Aberglaslyn Hall could provide:

Qualified Staff

- Qualified staff for expedition teams, whose leaders do not have the relevant qualifications needed for wild country. Aberglaslyn staff can work with you as part of your own staff supervision team
Fully supported expeditions £120 per group per day (min of 2 groups)

Accommodation

- Comfortable accommodation that expedition teams could use as a base to set off and / or finish expeditions from. This would be an ideal location for your Expedition Assessor to meet expedition teams for their pre expedition check
- B & B facilities for groups and leaders £23.95pp
- Camping facilities £10 per night (min of 8) - £100 per night for 10+

Training

- Qualified staff can deliver navigation training for leaders wishing to visit wild country areas £120 Per day / course (min of 2 people)
- Qualified staff can train participants in navigation necessary for Gold level £120 (min of 2 people) Per day / course
- Accommodation in the house or camping is available at extra cost.

Aberglaslyn Hall can accommodate up to 48 visitors in rooms of between 1 and 10. It is situated 5 miles south of Snowdon and is ideally placed for DofE groups embarking on training, practice or assessed expeditions.
