Re: Consultation on Leicestershire Waste Development Framework

I write to establish our objections to the allocation of preferred site status to the Brooksby Quarry site:

- 1) The rural area of Melton Mowbray and surrounding villages is adversely affected by recent increases in traffic. The A607 in particular carries increased numbers of heavy vehicles. Part of the waste management framework outlines the importance of transporting waste by means other than road. The use of the Brooksby site would offer no choice than to take all waste by road thus increasing traffic movement on a dangerous and busy road.
- 2) The Brooksby site is an attractive and diverse habitat for wildlife. There is potential for land and water contamination which would destroy areas of beauty and diversity.
- 3) The future of the quarry site was agreed with conditions regarding the restoration of the environment to an attractive condition at the completion of extraction. Land fill would not make this requirement sustainable.

In short I believe the allocation of preferred site status contravenes many of the objectives set out, by the county Council, in its own framework.
