Nigel,

Thank you for your e mail of the 20th December 2007 in response to our comments of the 28th November 2007 on the Leicester MWDF.

As stated in our telecon a short time ago, may we initially congratulate the County on the transparency of the consultation management exercise. We have noted that the comments of this recent consultation are posted on the website and demonstrate an early acknowledgement of our comments.

In relation to your e mail, we have reviewed the plans in relation to our Leicester and Ellistown sites. We welcome that the draft Mineral Consultation Area extends beyond the existing permission areas, thus safeguarding potential future reserves.

In relation to the Ellistown plan we note that the MCA excludes part of the existing permitted area and thus we have amended this in green. The green lines tail off to dotted lines representing the permission outline, however the MCA would of course continue around the rest of the MCA as set out on the plan. We have also amended the plan using a blue line which we believe should represent the terminus of the MCA in that area. Extension further west from this point serves to include the residential areas which would not seem beneficial in this instance.

In relation to Leicester we have amended the plan in green to represent the residential properties along Pretoria Road. As above, it would not seem beneficial to include these in the MCA. We welcome the otherwise broad MCA for Leicester.

We look forward to working with you in the further development of the MWDF.

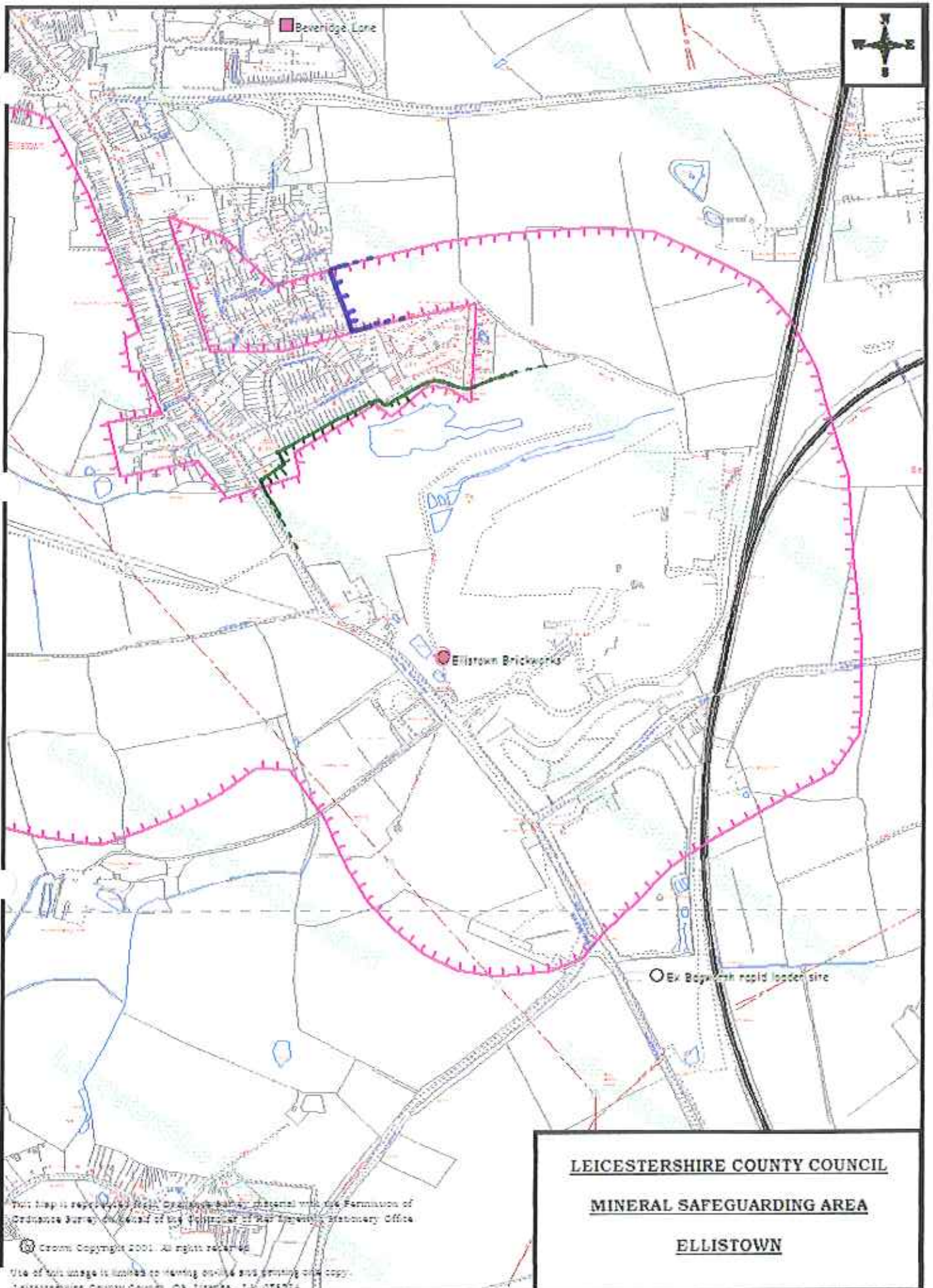

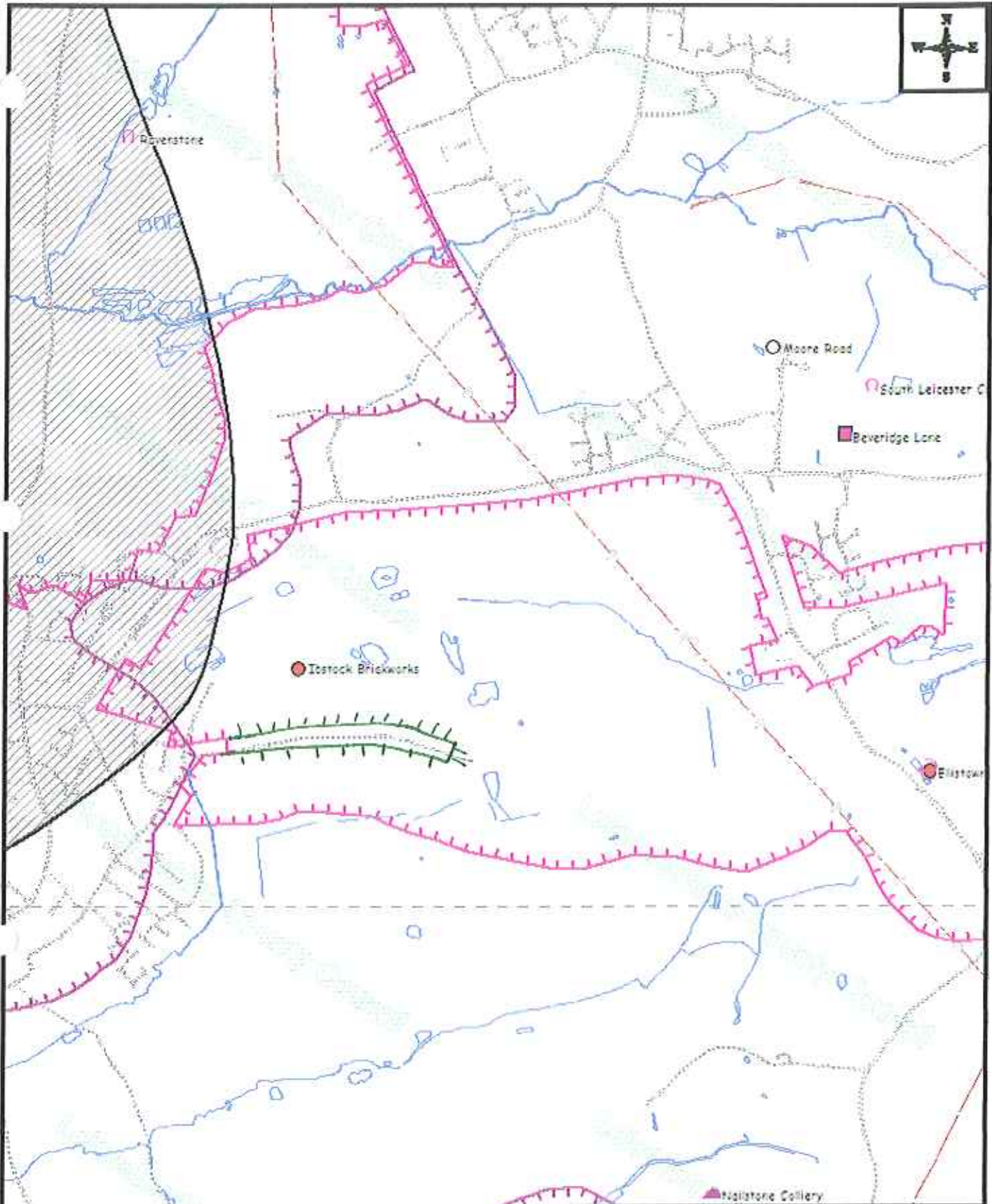
