The NFU would like to comment briefly on the preferred options further consultation:-

Page 4, para 2.7. We would object to the phrase "or bad land". It's not bad, just poorer agricultural quality land. It might be very good for nature conservation, for example.

Page 15, para 4.17. We would not want agricultural land to be precluded from the search for waste management sites. Indeed it would be most suitable for green composting sites and should be actively promoted as such.
