Thank you for consulting the NFU on the above. We have two concerns. First, on page 46 paragraph 5.11 there are limits placed on development in the countryside, but what about composting? On farm composting is a good form of diversification and is best done in the countryside rather than on urban industrial estates with less nuisance and traffic. We would not wish to see the requirements of paragraph 5.11 prevent composting on farms.

Secondly, on page 58 policy DC16 agriculture must be added as an alternative for after use along with woodland, access and wildlife habitats. The wishes of the landowner must be taken into account and if an agricultural after use is sought it should not be ruled out by this policy.
