How to report hate incidents in Leicestershire

If we don't know about it we can't change it

Report Hate

Leicestershire working together to make a difference

Working in partnership, Leicestershire County Council is committed to creating an inclusive county and believes that everyone who lives or works in or visits Leicestershire has the right to be treated with dignity and respect and to live without fear of hatred.

What is a hate incident?

A hate incident is any incident where you or someone else has been targeted because they or you are seen as being different. Anyone can be a victim of hate because of prejudice against their age, disability, gender identity, race, religion / belief or sexual orientation.

This means:

- You don't have to be from a minority group to be a victim of hate.
- If anyone says it's a hate incident it should be reported as such.
- No matter how trivial it may seem if you think it's a hate incident please report it.
- No evidence is required to report an incident, it's the 'perception' that counts.

An incident can take many forms - it may be physical, verbal or written.

Why is it important to report hate incidents?

If we don't know about it we can't change it!

Reporting makes a difference ... to you, your family and your life ... help us to help you.

Who can report an incident?

You may report an incident whether you are a victim, witness, or third party who has become aware of an incident.

- Incidents involving council staff, services, service users and visitors including those not involving the council may also be reported.
- You do not have to identify yourself.
- In most cases further action will only take place at the wishes of the victim or reporting person.
- Even if you do not wish for any further action to take place it is still important for you to report the incident.

Incidents may be reported:

- By completing the on-line reporting form or downloading a copy at www.leics.gov.uk/reporthate.
- By calling the Hate Incident Monitoring Project on 0116 305 8263.
- In confidence directly to your line manager if you are a Leicestershire County Council employee, this will then be referred to the Hate Incident Monitoring Project.
- By contacting your nearest reporting centre - a list is available from the above web site address.
- If you think the incident is a criminal offence you should report it to the police by calling 0116 222 2222.
